

CAMP RULES



Each of the following rules was made out of necessity and MUST be followed.

1. The entire property is to be left in the same condition in which it was received. This means cleaning up the campus, the cabins, the halls and staff rooms, closing the doors and windows, and ensuring sand buckets contain only sand. Each camp is responsible to the Camp Administrator for final clean-up and to the Department of Health for camp cleanliness, including the daily sanitation of the lavatories.
2. All garbage shall be placed in garbage cans and must not be left in any other place. Soft drink containers and paper shall be put into the appropriate recycling barrels.
3. No kitchen equipment, dishes or cutlery, or food is to be taken from the kitchen without the permission of the Director in agreement with the Head Cook. Campers assist in setting the tables, bringing the food to the tables and clean up.
4. No campers or counsellors are allowed in the kitchen unless authorized by the Head Cook.
5. Dishwashing must be supervised by the First Aid Supervisor and the procedures posted by the Department of Health authorities must be followed.
6. The Camp Administrator and the Board of Directors have full authority at all times.
7. **No** cars are permitted on the campgrounds for any reason.
8. **No** campfires are allowed other than in the allotted campfire pit area.
9. The Mound and Cross are **not** to be considered as a playground.
10. Kagama is a smoke-free property. The Board of Directors has designated the SMOKING AREA to be behind the storage building off camp property.
11. **No** alcoholic beverages or recreational drugs will be tolerated on the premises.
12. The use of profane language will not be tolerated.
13. Each group bears responsibility for water safety. It is required that a qualified lifeguard (minimum of Bronze Medallion current certification) be in attendance before any camper or staff member enters the water. Campers are to follow the waterfront rules established by the group and the island out from the camp shoreline is strictly off-limits for safety reasons.
14. Fire extinguishers are provided in case of emergency. **No one is allowed to play with or tamper with the fire extinguishers.**

It is expected of everyone connected with Camp Kagama that the welfare and safety of the campers is of prime importance. Nothing should be planned, done or said without bearing this in mind.
